DIVISIONS:

Youth, 5 th - 8 th Grade	Small Bore Rifle	45 feet/75 feet
Youth, 9 th - 12 th Grade	Small Bore Rifle	45 feet/75 feet
Men / Women	Small Bore Pistol	30 feet
Men / Women	Small Bore Rifle	45 feet/75 feet
Men / Women	Large Bore Pistol	30 feet



(Male and Female compete SEPARATELY in each category)

SMALL BORE:

Any firearm .22 rim fire magnum or under, including BB pellet, and air guns

LARGE BORE:

Any firearm larger than .22 rim fire magnum that is allowed in the indoor shooting range

PISTOLS:

Any single shot, revolver (single or double action) or semi-automatic pistol with a barrel length of 10" or less. NO SCOPE or aim point sighting system.

RIFLES:

Any .22 rim fire magnum or less, single shot, lever action, bolt action, pump action, or semi-automatic rifle. Open sights and scope sights will compete separately. All rifles compete in the same class.

TARGETS:

Pistol - NRA Pistol Target Rifle - NRA Rifle Target
All targets used for competition must be initialed by the Shooting Range Supervisor.

SCORING:

Scoring of the targets will be ring score. *Example: 1 hit in X ring (rifle only) counts 10 points, 1 hit in the 10 ring counts 10 points, 1 hit in the 9 ring counts 9 points, and so on. In the event of a tie, the shooter with the most hits in the X (rifle) or 10 (pistol) rings will be the winner. If both shooters have the same number of X (rifle) or 10 (pistol) ring hits, the 10 or 9 ring hits will then be counted, and so on. If there is still a tie, there will be a shoot off between the tied shooters (rifle will use an A17 target and pistol will use a B-2 target). If a bullet breaks a scoring ring, it is given the higher point value. The Shooting Range Supervisor has the final decision.*



COURSE OF FIRE:

5 SHOTS, NO TIME LIMIT

PISTOL:

Standing without support, no leaning against walls of shooting booth or shooting table. One or two hands, single or double action.

RIFLE:

Any position, no leaning against walls of shooting booth or shooting table. Sitting is allowed, using the shooting table to support the arms only. When sitting, the firearm must be supported by the shooter's body only. The firearm cannot touch the table or wall of the booth. The shooter may not lean against the walls of the booth.

PRONE:

Shooting from the prone position is allowed. The firearm must be supported by the shooter's body only. It cannot touch the floor or walls of the shooter's booth. Shooters may not support themselves by use of the walls of the shooter's booth.

OTHER:

Practice as much as you like before shooting for score. Remember, ONE try is free with admission. If you don't like your first score, try again. It's only .50 cents. All targets used for score must be initialed by the Shooting Range Supervisor
